

## PLAYING DRESS-UP

Playing dress-up: is it to be another person? Can we surely gain trust with ways of pretending to be other people? It would depend on whether the plan gives those involved in the "acting out" safe ways. Is it fun to pretend, engage, and tease each other in the marriage? Wearing fun ornaments brings contentment when there is a safe way to engage in playful love and heartfelt enjoyment.

Ornaments are clothing used to present a sexually appealing way to the spouse. It would be a pleasure in the marriage bed to have costumes, various high heels, or certain underwear to wear at home if both spouses took pleasure in that way.

Let me give you another way of looking at this dressing-up plan. When picking out clothing attire, here is the boundary: Will wearing that ornament dishonor Yahweh or the spouse? Will the outfit demean your spouse or make them feel "dirty" or ashamed? A spouse will have to consider painful past actions that their spouse deals with to gauge how much "dressing up" can take form.

There must be clear communication with each other. If verbal communication is too uncomfortable, another way to communicate is to consider setting up a fill-in-the-blank question-and-answer form. Their spouse can list what is okay to wear and engage in and what is not. And there should be that safety net in knowing that no one will judge them but use what's learned to bring closeness through fun play. No spouse should feel less than important or wear an ornament that lowers self-esteem.

Some women take great esteem in having their husbands go high-heel shoe shopping with them. The man feels that his opinion is important. And the woman should feel comfortable telling her husband what would bring positive ways to please her visually in a sexual way.

Dressing up doesn't enhance sexual actions but provides another outlet to explore each other and learn the form of the spouse's body, which gives opportunities to get close in learning about each other and not just for the act.

Wearing work-style costumes or hair and body attire is a safe way to keep marriage parasites at bay. Don't bring others into the marriage bed for fulfillment. Wearing perfumes, makeup, jewelry, and ornaments will not affect how a person relates to King Jesus.

Our God Yahweh will not enter a third-wheel plan and take on sex with humans. That plan is Satan-based. Know that Yahweh is always there to bless the union and approve of the Christian married way in a Kingdom order plan. But if your spouse is uncomfortable with the idea of wearing high-heels, wearing sex-turning outfits, do not make them.

And do not go to adult porn stores. Stay out of sex toy stores. Get regular outfits that cater to flattering female curves from a public department store, which will not bring reproach but presents a pleasing Christian look.

The bottom line: Don't feel any shame if you want to get some high heels to wear at home for your husband to enjoy. If lingerie is not appealing, try wearing soft towels or silk robes and comforting each other to give a form of consideration to what your spouse would find attractive.

And please talk about the idea of wearing ornaments; don't just demand it. Visually pleasing ornaments leading into sexual engagement is not a Bible command; it's a form of consideration in the marriage bed, meant to be shared with your own spouse.
